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Greetings fellow St. John's alumni,

I have been thinking about the word "change." I looked up definitions and synonyms as I was preparing to write this message. As we go through our lives, there are many times of change. The college's website is undergoing an update that will launch in a couple of months with changes that should make it easier to navigate. The current site still has an alumni page with a place to update personal information. I would encourage you to let other alumni know of the website and to update their information. On the current website, there also is a link to register for the annual alumni banquet. The banquet will be at Northfield Center in Springfield on Saturday, Oct. 5. The class of 1974 is this year's 50th anniversary class, and 1974 graduate Nancy Eck has been organizing events for the class members to enjoy. Nancy and her fellow graduates have been working to confirm contact information for the class of 1974. She is planning on sending a separate communication to the class members regarding the banquet and weekend activities.

As some of you are aware this past year, I became the alumni board president as our former president, Brandon Leonard, class of 2018, as well as MSN, FNP class of 2024, unexpectedly passed away in 2023. He was honored posthumously at the May 2024 graduation with his parents and sister accepting his diploma. Brandon was one of those rare souls who left an impression on everyone he met.

At the alumni board luncheon for the graduates this past May, Sr. Trudy O'Connor, class of 1963, presented a copy of "The Nursing Sister: A Manual for Candidates and Novices of Hospital Communities" to graduate Justine Obert. Some of you may remember that this was the initial textbook for St. John's Hospital Training School and was entered into the Library of Congress in 1899. I found it on Amazon! It is an interesting historical question and answer format read of education for the nurse trainee at the turn of the 20th century. As much as things have changed in nursing, some things have not. Even after over 100 years, nurses still need to record information and be organized as the following excerpt details:

"Things important enough to write down.

- Q. What things should be written down by the nursing sister?
- 1. The hours at which medicine in to be given, and each time it is given, the hour to be crossed in the tablet.
- 2. How much beef tea or milk the doctor has ordered for the patient.
- 3. How often this nourishment should be given.
- 4. How long intervals should be left between certain kinds of medicine and certain kinds of food.
- Q. But what be done if this left to the discretion of the sister?

  She must carefully arrange the time for giving food in such a way as not to destroy the patient's appetite by giving medicine immediately before the food, or nauseating him by giving it too soon afterwards.
- Q. What will a good nurse have for all these things? She will have a well arranged time-table for all these things, written out for the day, and will need all her ingenuity and care to keep the hours of medicine and food exactly apart."

# A Message from the Chancellor



Greetings St. John's College Alumni,

I hope you all are well. I know it has been some time since you received a copy of the St. John's College Echo newsletter. As many of you know, Chancellor Charlene Aaron resigned from the college in May 2023, and I joined the college at the end of that month. This past year, my focus has been enrollment and college operations. I did have the opportunity to meet some of you during our Alumni and Friends Banquet in October 2023.

This past year, we have been working to ensure the college is academically excellent and financially sound. To that end, our undergraduate curriculum was reviewed and revised at both the pre-licensure BSN level and the RN to BSN level. The updated curriculum will launch in August for fall 2024. To work toward a financially sound college, a strategic enrollment plan was created and targeted focus has been given to increasing college enrollment. To that end, the college has had over a 200% increase in enrollment from fall 2023 to fall 2024.

As the college works toward becoming a financially sound institution, we are making some changes to historical alumni practices. Currently, the St. John's College Alumni Association does not do any fundraising and is not supported by the HSHS Foundation, the philanthropical arm of the system. Because of this, the college bears the cost of everything associated with alumni events and interactions. This includes the U.S. Postal Service mailing of The Echo newsletter and the annual St. John's College Alumni and Friends Banquet. The last time The Echo was mailed, about half of the newsletters were returned, and the total cost of the mailing was significant. Because of this, The Echo will be mailed to only those alumni who have a current physical address on file. Additionally, the annual banquet registration falls significantly short of covering the cost of the banquet. This year, we will need to charge \$55 per person for the Alumni and Friends Banquet, and we have had to discontinue any no-charge registrations. I thank you for your understanding and rest assured, the college is working with the alumni association to explore fundraising solutions.

As the landscape of higher education continues to change, please know that all these decisions are to ensure that the 138-year history of the college continues well into the future. This is particularly important as in 2023, 15 institutions of higher education announced closure, and 10 of those were religiously affiliated.\*

Lastly, I also would like to share that the college pursued and received capital funding to update our website. We are very excited for the new website launch at the end of this summer.

# A Message from the Dean of Academic Affairs



Hello alumni, and thank you for this opportunity to address you with a recap of the 2023-2024 school year. I am Dr. Elaine Hardy, Dean of Academic Affairs, and I am proud to start with our successful ACEN accreditation for the DNP program and re-accreditation for the master's program. Thank you to those who participated in the community meeting with the ACEN visitors, and thank you to the faculty and staff who participated in writing of the ACEN self-study report. With the recent exit of Dr. Charlene Aaron, we welcomed Dr. Traci Krause, Chancellor, who hit the ground running in her new role. We have had many changes in personnel, as well as facilities, and we are adjusting well to those changes.

This past year, we were able to send 20 students and faculty to the 2nd Annual Kinniebrew-McNeese Health Equity Conference, which focuses on the social, educational, political and economic determinants of health and thriving. Our students in the community health nursing and diverse populations II (Peds and OB) courses collaborated with the Early Learning Center and hosted a health fair for 3- to 5-year-olds and their caregivers. Our senior-level students participated in Student Nurse Political Action Day in Springfield, hosted by the Illinois American Nurses Association.

I have worked with faculty member, Meagan Burton, MS, RN, Assistant Professor, and Hannah Jugan, Dean of Student Services, to write for an Illinois Board of Higher Education (IBHE) Nursing School Grant, and we were awarded \$70,740 to help with faculty development, student success and renovation of our computer lab into a student success center. Those funds allowed faculty to attend local conferences, students to attend three-day Kaplan reviews at the end of their programs, and the college to purchase furniture for the student success center and the student lounge. Our NCLEX first-time pass rate for the first quarter of 2024 was 84%, and our first-time pass rate for second quarter of 2024 is 100%. Congratulations to our December 2023 and May 2024 alumni.



Congratulations to Assistant Professors Bettianne Casper, MSN, RN, CNE, and Cheryl Pope, MSN, RN, who were recipients of the FY24 IBHE Nurse

Educator Fellowship Award. The program is exclusive to accredited nursing programs. This yearly grant is awarded based on a competitive selection process and designed to promote the retention of highly qualified nursing faculty. Adjunct faculty, Malissa Talbert, MSN, RN, CMSRN, and I submitted an abstract to the 9th Annual Health Care Conference in San Antonio and won second place for her poster, "Nurse Retention: Creative Approaches from Leadership."

Looking to the future at the college, we are working diligently to increase our enrollment as we roll out a new undergraduate curriculum starting fall 2024 and prepare for our upcoming ACEN visit in 2025. We are working on increasing enrollment in the graduate program and will continue to encourage our alum to return for their doctor of nursing practice degree. I am encouraged that our students and faculty will become more involved in collaborating with the community and supporting policies that impact nursing. Thank you for your continued support as I serve the mission and vision of St. John's College of Nursing.

In addition to her professional activities, she adopted her son from China and is active in her church community and on her condo board.
