## CANCER CARE CLOSE TO HOME - IN DOOR COUNTY

When Debbie Olsonoski told her children she had cancer, they were shocked. "How could you be? You're healthy!" they said.

But it was true. On January 4, 2016, Debbie was diagnosed with triple-negative breast cancer. Treatment started right away with surgery to remove a lump and five lymph nodes, two of which were cancerous. A month later, she started chemotherapy.

Debbie chose HSHS St. Vincent Hospital Cancer Centers at Door County Cancer Center and was confident in the care she would receive. "I've told people there is a cancer center in Door County. Many people thought I traveled to Green Bay, but I tell them, 'No, there IS a cancer center in Door County, and they're great people, right in our neighborhood."

Debbie's family was her rock during her treatment. Their visit to Door County, their first in more than ten years, reassured them that she was receiving excellent care close to home. The proximity of the hospital was a source of immense comfort. Debbie drew strength from their love and encouragement during this challenging time.

During a particularly tough chemotherapy session, Debbie was feeling especially down and overwhelmed. A member of the Spiritual Care team visited her, bringing a small, beautifully wrapped gift—a soft, handmade prayer shawl donated by a local volunteer. The shawl was wrapped with a note that read, "You are in our thoughts and prayers. Keep fighting." The chaplain spent some time with Debbie, offering words of comfort and reassurance. The warmth of the prayer shawl and the caring presence of the Spiritual Care team helped lift Debbie's spirits, providing her with the emotional strength she needed to keep going. With your help, all patients can feel wrapped in warmth, support, and hope during their journey. You remind them that they are never alone.

Debbie's treatment included 32 radiation sessions, concluding in 2016. Debbie feels assured that if she faced cancer again, she knows she would be in good hands. "Having the cancer center in your neighborhood is a comforting feeling of being closer to home."

Emily\* dedicated her entire career to caring for others as a nurse. For years, she worked tirelessly, rarely missing a day of work. But in September 2021, everything changed. Emily was diagnosed with advanced-stage ovarian cancer, and suddenly, she found herself on the other side of the hospital bed.

This diagnosis turned Emily's world upside down.

After undergoing chemotherapy and surgery, doctors found a blood clot, which meant she would need to start a new medication and pay out-of-pocket.

Emily and her husband were both recently retired, and the financial burden of this new medication was overwhelming. Their income had significantly dropped, and they were just beginning to navigate this



new phase of life when the unexpected medical expenses started. Emily felt the weight of the world on her shoulders, trying to manage new insurance, a change in lifestyle and ongoing cancer treatments all at once.

Emily met with the team at HSHS St. Vincent Hospital Cancer Centers where she learned about the options she had, including help from the HSHS St. Vincent/St. Mary's Medication Assistance Fund. **This fund is**completely supported by generous donors like you. "I felt like I was drowning and couldn't come up for air. When I was told that there were options, I was so relieved," Emily recalls. "It is amazing not to have to think about the cost of that medication."

No longer having to worry about the cost of her essential medication, Emily could focus on what mattered most: her health and recovery.

Unfortunately, Emily's situation is not unique. In Wisconsin, thousands of people go without necessary medications each year because they simply can't afford them. 
